





### **Jottings**

After what seems like weeks of rain this winter, it was a relief to have a few really cold and frosty days with a sprinkling of snow. Looking out at my garden, there were many uncut stems of plants that I had left for the birds to eat. The seed heads were either unpalatable or the birds were preferring my bird food – there is work to be done before spring!

My 'Winter Beauty' Clematis, which had died back the last two winters, had green leaves and numerous cream flowers this January. A pale blue lris was flowering as well as an early yellow Primula. I gave my daughters bowls of early Narcissus for Christmas but they grew leggy and weak stemmed and were over in November, yet one stray bulb looked perfect in a pot in my garden after Christmas.

An Amaryllis that flowered 2 years ago, only produced a few leaves last winter but recently grew strong leaves and one beautiful 4 foot tall deep maroon flower stem with 4 flowers almost 8 inches across – never give up! The Pointsettia I was given in November continued to thrive on my kitchen windowsill and it will go outside once the risk of frosts is over and it will be happy all summer.

The 'Hugh Evans' Camelia which I planted on the north side of our cottage 2 years ago has produced its first welcome pink flowers and a young Forsythia next to it has grown extremely strongly and looks like it will be covered with early yellow blossom again. I inherited a pale cream Japonica (or should I say Chaenomeles) in this front garden which was covered with numerous buds and the flowers arrive before the leaves show and is always an early spring joy. The only downside is I seem to have to prune this shrub several times each year or it would grow enormous.

On the subject of pruning, a year ago I took a brave decision to cut down to almost ground level 2 elderly Clematis, I think 'Montana', that were growing 30 foot up a fir tree. They have both survived and this summer produced a huge amount of new growth and flowers that I am attempting to keep to shoulder height. Lengths of dead stems fall down from time to time and no doubt the tree is happier without the weight of the Clematis.

Other bulbs are beginning to show and I'm looking forward to finding out where I planted one pot full of 'Pheasant Eye' Narcissus – remember to write a label! I always look forward to our Spring Show but sadly I have to be in London this year so I am hoping one kind Committee member, or perhaps more than one, will arrange my exhibits for me?

- An 'Open Day' at the Revels saw the courts in constant use all afternoon for coaching 'taster' sessions, pickleball, the serve speed competition or just 'having a knock'.
- "Go Tennis" was appointed our professional coaching partner. The LTA accredited coaches delivered programmes for all ages and standards as well as individual lessons.
- Two Junior Camps were run in the summer and new half-term Junior Camps introduced.
- The new *Pay&Play*online court booking system for non-members was introduced, which has proven to be very popular.
- Conversion from *calendar-year*to 12-monthrolling memberships.e.g. if you join in April this year membership renewal is in April next year, not on 1st January.

There'll be more to come in 2024. #### JUST IMAGINE ...

Life without electricity, running water, main drains or gas. Your only modern convenience a telephone. That was the reality for John and Rosemary Northway who lived at Stanley Farm, the furthest north-western corner of Fernhurst Parish, where it abuts Liphook. Stanley was a working farm with sheep, cattle, chickens and rabbits.









Water was drawn from a well 186ft deep by hand until the landlord eventually installed a mechanical pump. Fresh water took too much hard work to use it for washing, that was done using rainwater. Cooking was done on an open fire or on a paraffin stove.

The lavatory, of course, was a little shed outside, just a bucket and a wooden seat.

Their drive was a mile long to reach a very minor road and another mile before they reached the village. The journey was always done by bicycle or on foot. Their children, three boys, therefore had a long walk before they even caught the bus to school.

After about 40 years, John Northway's declining health meant that they had to move to a house in Hammer with modern facilities in 2000.

When asked what the best thing about moving to a modern house, Rosemary said 'Oooh, having a vacuum cleaner!'


